When Westmorland and Furness came to Staveley in September the community told them our priority was to secure the Abbey for older people so that nobody has to leave the community for the social care they need.

They listened, and recorded what we said, but their Asset Review of the Abbev identified their priority for the site to work with a partner to build eleven affordable homes.

At Staveley Community Trust (SCT) we believe our proposal for the Abbey can deliver these homes by creating homes for carers, developing extra care apartments and running our property release scheme. So we are searching for a partner organisation to help us fulfil our aspirations.

Westmorland and Furness have asked the trustees to join them to consider the specification for their tender document. Something we are keen to do!

SCT is a community group dedicated to acquiring the Abbey for the whole community, and supporting older residents so they don't have to leave the
